FOOD: **Bring a picnic style lunch.** Grilling is permitted, and we'll let you know how the park is equipped soon. There are also plenty of sandwich shops and grocery stores all over town, too.

DRINK: **Bring a cooler filled with ice and your favorite beverages.** Beer and wine are allowed (with our permit) but only in the park. And please avoid glass containers. Also, there are no water fountains in the park, so be sure to bring water too.



GENERAL INFORMATION:

After about 3 hours of standing, you'll be glad you



brought lawn chairs or picnic blankets so you have a **place to sit**.

We all know how accurate weather forecasting is and August in Wisconsin can get into the go's, so plan to



bring a hat, beach umbrella, or a pop-up canopy for **shade**. There are also a lot of mature trees in the park near the shelter. Consider sunscreen and sunglasses too, just in case.

Because this is a public park, there will be others in the park who are not part of our event. We'll have a designated place for all to **check-in** where we'll collect a modest fee of \$25 and you'll receive a wristband that will distinguish you from other park visitors and allow you to be protected by our event's Alcohol Consumption Permit. It will also help us to "own" this area of the park.

There are **bathrooms** in at least one of the park buildings for our use. More on this as info is available.

Pets are allowed in the park, but must be in the control of their owner or in control of their owner (whichever is more intelligent) at all times. If you



bring a pet, bring its leash, food, and water. And don't forget to **clean up after your pet**, too.

This is a **LEAVE NO TRACE** event, meaning that when we're gone, there should be no physical evidence that we were ever in the park. So bring a trash bag. If you bring it into the park, you need to leave with it. This includes any and all leftovers, trash, cigarette butts, etc. It also includes the coals left over from grilling. The park



does not have dumpsters for us to fill up with our trash. Keep that in mind when you decide what to bring. And, please, don't expect someone else to clean up after you. We've all had decades to grow up and become responsible, so let's show it. We want the city to welcome us back in 5 years!

This is a **rain or shine** event, which means it takes place on August 10, regardless of weather conditions because many are traveling great distances to attend. The Farmers Almanac predicts below average rainfall in August and the hottest periods of summer to be between mid-June and mid-July!
